

INFORMATION ABOUT THE ABILITATOR AND ITS PRIVACY

WHAT IS THE ABILITATOR?

- The Abilitator is an easy-to-use questionnaire to provide you with information about your ability to work and function.
- You can give your answers on paper or electronically.
- You can respond either on your own or together with another person.
- The other person can be your employee or a family member.
- When you complete the Abilitator questionnaire at least twice, you will receive information about changes in your ability to work and function.
- The Abilitator will give you personal feedback and, if necessary, suggest further measures to maintain or improve your well-being.
- The Abilitator helps you assess your situation, making it easier to consider further options.
- Responding to the Abilitator questionnaire is voluntary.
- The Abilitator is developed within the Social inclusion and change of work ability and functional capacity (Solmu) coordination project. The Solmu project is funded by the European Social Fund (ESF) and implemented by the Finnish Institute of Occupational Health.

DATA PROTECTION AND CONFIDENTIALITY IN THE ABILITATOR

- By responding to the Abilitator the respondent gives their consent for the data to be used anonymously in the research activities of the Finnish Institute of Occupational Health.
- No separate written consent is required.
- Only the concerned organisation can associate the identifiers used in the service with individuals. The Finnish Institute of Occupational Health cannot associate the Abilitator data with individual persons nor can the Finnish Institute of Occupational Health obtain identifiable personal data.
- The Finnish Institute of Occupational Health keeps the data it collects secure and uses it in its research activities so that individuals cannot be identified, even indirectly.
- The Finnish Institute of Occupational Health may, using its discretion, share this anonymous data with third parties; for example, for the purposes of scientific research.
